Epidemiology

Births and Deaths in England and Wales in 1965

The infant mortality rate in England and Wales fell to a new low figure in 1965, being 19.0 per thousand live births, compared with 19.9 in 1964. The stillbirth rate at 15.7 per thousand total births was also a record low figure. The live birth rate was 18.1 per thousand population, which is much the same as in the previous two years. death rate was 11.5 per thousand population and has not altered appreciably for ten years. These are provisional statistics issued by the Registrar-General.

Influenza

Influenza is still epidemic in Great Britain and is in general mild. Of the 111 deaths from it in England and Wales in the week ending 29 January 57 (about 50%) were of persons aged 75 and over. The 58 deaths in the previous week were similarly distributed by age.


Virus B has been further isolated from different parts of the country, mainly in schoolchildren. Both A and B strains are thought to be infecting adults.

Deaths from pneumonia numbered 1,461 and from bronchitis 1,282 in England and Wales in the week ending 29 January. These were 602 and 545 (or about 70%) higher than in the corresponding week last year.

Weekly new claims for sickness benefit are about 30% higher than last year.
