## Why we can't trust clinical guidelines

Due to an editing error, the table in this Feature does not correctly display the competing interests for the author Jagoda (BMJ 2013;346:f3830, doi:10.1136/bmj.f3830). The published table incorrectly lists "FERNE only" as a competing interest for Jagoda and does not specify that this interest was disclosed. Furthermore, Genentech and AstraZeneca should have been
