**Corrections****Is Quinidine Outdated?**

In the leading article published in the issue of 8 February, page 331, it was stated that quinidine polygalacturonate has recently been marketed embedded in a porous insoluble plastic tablet for slow release. Quinidine polygalacturonate is not yet marketed in the United Kingdom, and it is not to be marketed as a slow release preparation; the compound has been marketed in the U.S.A. as a less toxic alternative to quinidine sulphate.
