Remuneration of S.H.M.O.s and S.H.D.O.s

The Association has presented a memorandum of evidence on the remuneration of senior hospital medical and dental officers to the Review Body on Doctors and Dentists Remuneration.

It was noted in last year's Annual Report of Council (*Supplement*, 1963, 1, 178) that the Council had reaffirmed the policy that the remuneration of senior hospital medical officers should be 80% of the consultant scale. The Joint Consultants Committee also supported this policy, and agreed to bring it to the notice of the Review Body at an appropriate time, after the 14% award had been implemented.

About 2,150 whole- and part-time S.H.M.O.s, and about 259 whole- and part-time S.H.D.O.s are in post, according to the latest data issued by the Ministry of Health.
