## Policy After Hospital Mishaps

In a report in our medico-legal column on 26 April (p. 257) we reported an inquest on a patient who had had an operation to repair a septal defect. We wrongly stated that the patient died during an operation performed by Mr. Donald Ross. In fact, Mr. Donald Ross operated on the patient, who later bled and was taken to the theatre by Mr. Donald Ross's senior registrar, Mr. Barry Ross, who performed a second operation. It was during the second operation that the incident with the endotracheal tube occurred. The patient was returned to the intensive care ward, where he survived for a further eight days.

Passages quoted from the evidence at the inquest and attributed to Dr. Donald Ross related in fact to the evidence of Mr. Barry Ross, who dealt with a line of inquiry raised by the coroner.
