



Getting Started with BMJ Learning



It provides over 1,000 interactive learning modules, across over 70 specialty areas, to assist in the continuing medical education (CME) and postgraduate training for doctors and other healthcare professionals.



How to access


Getting started is easy, just follow the steps below.

1. To register go to cds.bmj.com and click 'Register', or press 'Login' if you have previously registered and enter your login details. After registering, you will need to visit this page every time you want to access BMJ Best Practice, so ensure that you bookmark it for future reference.





3. Once you have filled out your email address, you will be taken to a short 'registration form'. Please fill out the form and in the last box, input the access code that was sent to you in your access email. Click 'Register'.





4. Once you have either registered or logged in you will be taken to your BMJ Hub. Click on 'Learning and assessment' to go to the BMJ Learning website.



5. Once on the BMJ Learning website you will see your personal homepage which is personalised using the information we know about you. You can check this information or update it at any time in the "Update your details" bar at the top of the page.

Modules

Selecting modules to complete



Search

You can use the search bar to type subjects or keywords which are of interest to you. This will display a list of the modules which are relevant to your search topic.



Browse modules

You can use the browse by specialty function to view all of the modules on the site, sorted alphabetically and by key groupings. Either select one of the module groups to the left of the browse box or the letters across the top to see a list of modules in the chosen category.



Select modules on your homepage

You'll see a selection of modules on your personal BMJ Learning homepage. These are tailored for you based on your profession, speciality and country. To view any of these just select the module title.



Viewing module information

When you select any module, you will be taken to a page of information to help you decide if the module is of interest to you. This page will show:

- An overview of the module, including the objectives
- The estimated time the module will take to complete
- The module authors
- The organisations which accredit the module
- The type of module this is, and if it includes audio or video.

Completing modules

From the module information page you will be given the option to either "Start module" or "Add to portfolio". You can add the module to your BMJ Portfolio to complete at a later date. If you do not choose to start the module now, it will be automatically added to your BMJ Portfolio.

After you have selected "Start module" you can then work through the module pages by clicking on the "Submit" button at the bottom of the screen, your progress is automatically saved. You can also go back by clicking on "Previous" or print the page.



Getting your certificate

When you have completed a module you can collect your certificated by selecting "Get certificate", which can be printed, or downloaded and saved in your records. You will be given a choice of who you would like to accredit the module from a list of accrediting organisations. You can also collect your certificate at a later date from your BMJ Portfolio.
