Corrections

Paragraph (9) of the B.M.A.'s Memorandum of Evidence to Mrs. Justice Lane's Committee (Supplement, 29 January, p. 33) was incorrectly printed. The correct version is reproduced here.

"(9) In the Association's view every woman who has proper grounds for an abortion under the terms of the Act should be able to obtain it in an N.H.S. hospital within reasonable reach of her home. Termination of pregnancy should be undertaken at the earliest possible stage, preferably by the twelfth week, and it should be considered normal practice for the gynaecologist to refuse termination after the twentieth week. Reports continue to emphasize that dangers increase with the duration of pregnancy.^{3,4} Every general practitioner should have facilities available for his patients to undergo abortions under the N.H.S. within reasonable access to his practice, and, in order to facilitate such arrangements and avoid curtailment of other services, more accommodation and staff (both medical, nursing, and social work) should be made available in hospitals. The establishment of special clinics for abortion within general hospitals should be carefully considered where necessary. These should be geographically sited close to the full facilities of a gynaecological unit. In fairness to patients and colleagues care should be taken to ensure that in every area there are sufficient gynaecologists willing to provide an abortion service."

The heading to paragraph (10) of the memorandum should have been "Clarification of the Act."
