Deputizing Services

SIR,—I have read Dr. C. J. G. Franklin's letter (July 23, p. 51) and that of Drs. R. G. Wigoder and H. G. Jeffs (August 6, p. 65). I am frankly at a loss to connect them. The former is a simple statement of a point of view, whilst the latter has no purpose beyond an unwarranted attack upon the integrity of the local consultants. If it were not for this, I should feel that the letter deserved nothing but to be ignored.

Drs. Wigoder and Jeffs are certainly entitled to any private view they wish to hold, but I must hasten to apologize lest any of our consultant colleagues should feel that their attitude is held more widely by G.P.s in the area. In their letter they ask if any member of the local medical committee has attempted to obtain the services of a consultant at the week-end, bank holidays, or after 7 p.m. The short answer is simply, yes; indeed, I have often found that the easiest time to obtain a domiciliary consultation is after 9 p.m. when many consultants are to be found at home. As with the general practitioner, the consultant tends to lead a busy day. In out-patients and in the wards he may be less readily available for one reason or another, but at the times that Drs. Wigoder and Jeffs suggest I can say that I have never had serious difficulty in obtaining a consultant opinion. This I believe to be true of most of my colleagues who practise in this area.-I am, etc.,

SIR,-Drs. R. G. Wigoder and H. G. Jeffs (August 6, p. 65) raise an important issue when they ask for a 24-hour all-the-vear-round service of consultants (in every specialty, presumably ?). I know of no statute law or regulation which compels consultants to provide such a service, though it is common practice for specialists to participate in on-call rotas for emergencies in hospital, at least in general surgery, orthopaedics, gynaecology, and E.N.T. Inquiry at one or other local hospital should generally provide the information of who is on call. I frequently get called out on Sundays, public holidays, and even while on annual leave spent at home, as do most of my consultant colleagues.

Drs. Wigoder and Jeffs are exceptionally fortunate to be practising in an area (S.E. London) which has at least ten general hospitals within a radius of less than 8 miles and very many consultants living within easy reach. I wonder if their complaint is shared by many general practitioners. Perhaps the list of consultants on the domiciliary visiting scheme is out of date in the S.E. Metropolitan Region. Some of us might welcome regulations of the type envisaged by Drs. Wigoder and Jeffs. But why begrudge us the £4 4s. fee (taxed at source under P.A.Y.E. and surtaxed as well) ?-I am, etc.,
