Epidemiological mysteries continue: we don't know why the severity of myocardial infarction is declining (p 892), nor whether the "increased" prevalence of asthma over the past few years is due merely to a change in diagnostic labelling (p 898)? Yet again more research is needed. Research and review are certainly needed into colposcopy. Although additional resources are required in some districts, many important questions have also to be answered before the service can be

improved (p 899). There was at least one positive outcome to the King's Cross disaster: the experience of the UCH team has led to an algorithm for the early management of inhalational injury in fire victims (p 902). Finally, another positive outcome could be readily achieved if teaching hospitals took up John Pearce's challenge to audit student teaching at district general hospitals; at the very least the lecturers should be told about the process and the outcome (p 925).
