

July 1972, p. 303) is to be introduced. Consultative proposals are set out in a document issued by the Department of Employment. Among the major recommendations are that responsibility for safety and health at work should be transferred from the various government departments concerned to a new statutory authority. A number of Acts of Parliament now extant would be unified under the new legislation to extend coverage to all employment. New and better arrangements for enforcing safety and health requirements are proposed including setting up of inspectorates. The protection envisaged for work people is also aimed to include the general public who may be at risk by living in or being near an industrial area. *Proposals for a Safety and Health at Work Bill*, RB/3B 1973, Department of Employment.

Chair of Cardiovascular Diseases

The British Heart Foundation has donated £250,000 to the Royal Postgraduate Medical School for the Professor Sir John McMichael chair, named in recognition of Sir John's services to the British Heart Foundation since its inception 11 years ago and his 27 years of professorship at the Royal Postgraduate Medical School.

Mercury and Cadmium in Food

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries, and Food, Mr. Joseph Godber, in a written reply to a House of Commons question, stated that according to the toxicity subcommittee's report there is "no evidence of harm to health from present levels of mercury and cadmium in food for the average consumer." The Government therefore proposes to continue monitoring both these metals and where possible commission epidemiological investigations "on certain individual consumers who might have an above-average dietary intake of cadmium." The Toxicity Subcommittee of the Committee on Medical Aspects of Chemicals in Food and the Environment is chaired by Professor G.
