Andrew James Johnson

General and respiratory physician Kent and Canterbury Hospital (b 1945; q Cardiff 1969; FRCP), died from a cerebral glioma on 14 January 2015

Andrew James Johnson (“Andy”) qualified with distinction. He undertook specialist training at the Brompton Hospital and in Edinburgh. Appointed to the Kent and Canterbury Hospital in 1983, his impact was immediate; he introduced new techniques and expanded the department.

An outstanding teacher, he was sometime clinical tutor, director of medical education, undergraduate subdean, and associate educational fellow of King’s College, London, and he was

responsible for supervising the education of numerous students undergoing their medical training in the south east. He organised the MRCP examination in Canterbury.

He was much loved by his patients as a caring doctor and was a very approachable clinical colleague, whose opinion was highly regarded.

He leaves his wife, Jean; four children, two of whom followed him into the medical profession; and two grandchildren.
