Sarah Scott-Barrett was born in Birmingham, the daughter of a surgeon. She was educated at Edgbaston High School and trained at Guy's Hospital Medical School. After graduating, she worked at Guy's, the Whittington, St George's, the Royal Marsden, the National Heart, and the Royal Brompton hospitals.

After a brief time in anaesthetics, she switched to radiology and was based at Charing Cross Hospital, with specialist training at the Royal Brompton and Royal Marsden hospitals.

She was appointed as a consultant radiologist at the Norfolk and Norwich University Foundation Hospital NHS Trust in July 1996, the first female consultant in the department. Sarah was an excellent radiologist with particular expertise in cancer imaging, and she took great pride in her clinical work.

She worked hard and did not suffer fools gladly but was a fiercely loyal colleague and friend. She was central to the radiology department organising social functions, collections for significant events, and charitable donations with equal enthusiasm and dedication, and she always brought a splash of colour with her love of designer clothes, shoes, and handbags.

Sarah was at her happiest when she was at a cricket match, in a gallery, or at the opera. When she could combine these with work, even better, and she always enjoyed radiology conferences in Vienna and travelling with friends.

She had a great sense of humour and a wicked quick wit. It was impossible to spend time with her without laughing. She was kind and thoughtful and looked after her people.

She leaves a son, William; a sister, Liz; and a brother, Johnny. She will be missed by everyone who knew and loved her, both professionally and personally.
