## Correction

This Analysis article (*BMJ* 2016;352:h6952, doi:10.1136/bmj.h6952) by Peter Wilmshurst incorrectly states that the University of London has “ignored repeated requests to withdraw his [Anjan Kumar Banerjee’s] Master of Surgery (MS) degree during the 15 years since it was confirmed to be based on fraudulent data.” This error is repeated in a linked Editorial (*BMJ* 2016;352:i293, doi:10.1136/bmj.i293) by Richard Smith, which says that “the University of London has not withdrawn his MS degree,” and in an Editor’s Choice (*BMJ* 2016;352:i674,

doi:10.1136/bmj.i674), which refers to Banerjee retaining “a masters degree that was based on fraudulent data.”

The University of London has since told *The BMJ* that Banerjee’s degree was revoked on 21 January 2015 after a full inquiry, including the convening of a full review panel at which Banerjee was represented. No public announcement of the revocation of the degree was made.

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
